## RESULTS OF AUCTION #85

Ten participants were present at the auction, and thirty other members sent in bids by post and email, so the wide variety of material for sale attracted a good number of bidders. Four lots sold above £100: unsurprisingly the classic Littleton armorial from a 17thC copper plate (lot 3, £175 versus a low estimate £75); secondly, lot 19 for Princess Beatrice, Queen Victoria's youngest child (£150, est £25); thirdly, the unusual block of Emery Walker labels (lot 96, which saw competition taking the price to £220, against £35 foreseen); and finally, £115, as quite a modest price for over 60 examples of work by Jim McCready (lot 110 did not have an estimate, although £2-£3 per plate had seemed likely).

Gooden's charming engraved label for his wife made £75 (lot 34, est £30), Sherborn's monogram for Victoria Mary, Duchess of York, later Queen Mary, went for £ 70 (lot 10, est £25), the second largest of Pine's George I gift plates to Cambridge University fetched £65 (lot 148, est £35), two plates by John Buckland Wright found a buyer at £60 (lot 62, est £15), the scarce Rose Mary Paul by Laurence Housman also sold for £60 (lot 124, est £35), as did Charles Stewart King by Voysey (lot 171, est £40), and Joseph Rix's 1857 pictorial made £56 (lot 166, est £25). Some bookplates seemingly overpriced were those of Rev Sydney Smith at £55 (lot 81, est £8 only), Adelaide Livingstone by Rex Whistler at £52 (lot 79, est £20), and the two large armorials of Charles Morse, forced up to £50 each (lots 4 & 5, est £15 each). Beilby's allegorical pict arm of Thos. Wentworth and Tilden's work for Ivor Novello were choice items each at £50 (lots 147 and 151, est £30 and £18), various armorials by Jack Badeley sold well, and a colourful armorial by Roger Barnes named for Elizabeth II Queen of New Zealand saw a hammer price of £46 (lot 125, est £20). There were good prices for labels by Will Carter (lot 33) and

Reynolds Stone (lot 38). The Paul Nash picture frame for Samuel Courtauld (lot 77) went at only £5 above its £40 estimate, and another frequently seen bookplate, for Kenneth Rae by Rex Whistler, cost its buyer £43 (lot 75, est £30). Thackeray's well-known design for Edward Fitzgerald sold at £40 (lot 70, est £30) and other famous people were Quiller Couch (£35), Ramsay Macdonald (£30) and Anthony Trollope (£12). Sir Francis Fust, notable for his 40 quarterings, fetched £28. There were 51 lots selling at or below their estimates. The sale total of £4,153 compares with an aggregate estimate of £3,189.
