Takes place on 7 May 2022

At long last we shall resume holding auction meetings in person. Everyone attending must have received a third or fourth vaccination. When cancelling December's auction we promised a bumper offering in the Spring, which is now the case.

If you are not attending the meeting, your bids must reach Peter McGowan by Monday, 2 May 2022. Mail postal bids to him at Nethergreen House, 9 The Green, Ruddington, Notts NG11 6DY or send an email to petermcgowan2016@gmail.com He will confirm receipt of bids, but please ensure you include your current address and contact details.

If two bids of the same amount are received for a lot, then the bid received first takes precedence, so early bidding is desirable. Reserves apply, either at the default value of 75% of the presale estimate or at a sum set by the seller (not exceeding the presale estimate). No bid will be accepted below the reserve, but you may, if you wish, send in bids at the 75% reserve (rounded up to the nearest pound). However, take into account that presale estimates are not a consistent guide to final price at auction, and may sometimes be greatly overbid. Successful bidders were asked to pay for their lots before despatch. Purchases to a combined value over £20 are sent insured.

REPORT ON AUCTION 94 - HELD ON 2 OCTOBER 2021

An Eric Gill specialist was the purchaser the Earl of Cawdor plate (Lot 255) at £343, nearly four times the £90 paid for a similar item in 2010. CP Hornung's *Bookplates by Harold Nelson* sold well at £85, as did three Henry J Haley ex-libris at £75. Next came a large size early armorial of Francis Gwyn of Lansanor 1698 for £60, King George V was not expensive at £44; at the same price nor were CB Cochran's two plates. The aggregate price for 220 lots sold was £4608 (estimate £3953). This split into 92 lots for £2916 (at or above their £1800 estimate), and 128 lots at £1692 (£2153 estimate), so many were at their 75% reserve. The 35 unsold lots were estimated at £619. Duplicates realised £161. In the second half of the auction, lots 256 to 468, there were 155 lots sold for £978 (estimate £909) with 58 lots unsold (estimate £512). In total the 39 bidders paid £5747. The Society's first auction, held on 26 February 1983, comprised 87 lots. These realised £424. Gooden's Danson and Courtauld plates sold for £6 and £3, with Viscount Lascelles by Helard at £2.50.
