No bid is accepted below the reserve (rounded up to the nearest pound). Take into account that presale estimates are often greatly overbid, so not a consistent guide to final price at auction. Successful bidders are asked to pay for their lots before despatch. Purchases to a combined value over £20 are sent insured. Lots 333-400 are detailed online only.
