Corradim (Rome) on steel, Ex Libris Principe Paolo Francesco Boncompagni Ludovisi. (2) 16
- 166 WPB 1908 but by Charles Bird: Fritz Ponsonby, Grenadier Guards, pict of books & music on shelf in front of open window. (1) 14
- 167 The Most Noble Henry Duke of Beaufort 1705, early arm, F27572; [Percy, Duke of Northumberland] coronet, badge & date 1867, F23296; Edward Duke of Norfolk Earle Marshall of England, Chip arm, F15479 plus the small additional bequest label. (4) 22
- 168 Henry Duke of Kent 1733, F12832; [Percy, Duke of Northumberland] coronet, badge & date 1886, F23302; Duke of Buccleugh [Scott] F26257; Carton Library [Duke of Leinster] F10616; Edward Duke

- 169 Sherborn arm for Hugh Richard Arthur Duke of Westminster 1899 (the smaller size); anon arm for [Campbell] Duke of Argyll, F4945; Beaufort, arm with supporters for 3rd Duke (see BEA 5 in Strawberry Leaves. (3) 20
- 170 Early arms [Bentinck]The Right Honble William Earl of Portland Viscount Woodstock [etc etc] 1704, B.113/F2257; Robert Montagu Duke & Earl of Manchester Viscount Mandevile & Baron of Kimbolton, F20873 (which is a re-engraving of the 1704 plate for Charles). (2) 35
- 171 [Cavendish] The Most Noble William Duke of Devonshire Knight of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, early armorial, the fine large size plate c.1705, F5430. (1) 35
- 172 Paul Jodrell of Duffield in ye County of Derby Esqr Clerk of ye Honble. House of Commons, the splendid large early arm, F16507, dating from c.1705. The original copper plate was exhibited at the V&A exhibition in 1979. This item is an excellent Victorian reprint from that copper. (1) 24
- 173 Rare mid-17thC anon arm of Bradshaw, with motto Pacis Justitia Basis, F3493, from the Julia Warde-Aldam collection. Minor loss of ruled border at bottom left. John Bradshaw (1602-59, see *Oxford DNB*) judge, regicide, President of the Council of State. Bequeathed all his law books, and selected other books, to his nephew Henry Bradshaw (d.1698); the collection appears to have been dispersed in or by the early 19thC. These arms, from the same copper, appear on the title page of Payne Fisher's verses in honour of Cromwell's victories (*Irenodia gratulatoria*, 1652), dedicated to John Bradshaw. We don't know if the copper was engraved first for this book or as a bookplate. A print, doubtless derived from the title page or the printer's waste, occurs in the Bagford Collection (British Library, Harl.5915). John Bagford (1650/51-1716), bookseller and antiquary collected ballads and a great range of ephemeral printing. (1) 70
- 174 Rare mid-17thC Carolian anon arm of Southwell, F27638, from the Julia Warde-Aldam collection. It is a matter for conjecture whether or not this and an excessively rare larger size are earlier bookplates for Sir Robert Southwell (1635-1702, see F.27634 and Lee's British Bookplates). (1) 45

- 179 Victoria on a ribbon (Princess, later Queen), a very simple engraved label, NIF, Lee #145 and described as uncommon. (1) 40
- 180 Royal Library V RI Windsor Castle, sgd: GWE'97', arms in garter with crown, but no supporters, middle size of Eve's etched plate for Queen Victoria, Lee #157. (1) 45
- 181 V RI Royal Library Windsor, sgd: GWE, crown and lion, smallest size of Eve's etched plate for Queen Victoria, Lee #158. (1) 40
- 182 Prince Christian of Schleswig-Holstein-Sonderburg-Augustenburg, anon arm on mantle, coronet above, four helms & crests, collars of Prussian Order of the Black Eagle & of the Garter. Great-grandson of George III's sister, Caroline Matilda, Queen of Denmark. Married Queen Victoria's 2nd daughter. Lee #40. Seems uncommon though Lee does not say so. (1) 80
- 183 Coronet with initials VM in oval cartouche surrounded by may blossom, sgd: CW Sherborn Sc., for Princess Victoria Mary, Duchess of York, later Queen Mary wife of George V, dating to their marriage year 1893 or later, F33234, Lee #124. (1) 60
- 184 Based on key-plate at Hampton Court, Mary, in cartouche, crown above between winged cherubs, roses, thistles and shamrock below, on a silk-like ground, all in festoon border with heads & roses at corners, sgd: WPB but by Osmond, 1910, Lee #126. (1) 75
